# Dear Parents/carers

We are focusing on Financial Education this week. All teachers have planned this across a variety of curricular areas such as social studies, literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing. We feel that January is a good time to think about financial health and wellbeing. It is a good time to explore credit, debt, spending and savings etc and to work with partners, businesses and volunteers to explore the themes that are appropriate for each class. You may be aware from news items or other sources that the Scottish government have invested time and money in a special focus on raising attainment and achievement across the country over the next few years. All schools are encouraged to be rigorous in their approaches to improving attainment in literacy and numeracy. Our improvement priorities this session encompass this priority. As part of our raising attainment focus we will provide a special focus on numeracy this term that involves additional support and challenge. All pupils are invited to attend a numeracy after school club for a six week block. The special focus will be on improving mental agility. The club will be led by teachers in school. This will begin week beginning 25<sup>th</sup> January. If we are oversubscribed we will organise a slightly different arrangement to ensure that all who wish to attend can be accommodated. Please encourage your child to attend. Complete the consent form and return to school for Thursday 21 January 2016, so that we can organise this.

## **OUR WORLD IN THE PAST- INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING (IDL)**

This term the children will begin their new DL learning theme which is a focus on a period of time from long ago. The children will look at this from a social studies, literacy, numeracy, technologies and expressive arts perspective. We are working on reciprocal teaching approaches in reading so some of the reading texts will be nonfiction related to the theme. We will also try to plan an educational visit out of school associated with the IDL theme for each class if this is possible. If it is not possible then the class will have an educational visit in term 4. P5 have been quick off the mark and are visiting Vikingar in Largs as part of their focus on The Vikings.

Our IDL themes this term are as follows:

- P1 Queen Margaret of Scotland and other Kings and Queens
- P2 Knights and Castles
- P3 The Egyptians
- P4 The Romans
- P5 The Vikings
- P6 Ancient Greece
- P7 Ancient China

The children will learn about the above time periods and how it was to live and work at that time. They will also look at what was considered a technological advance at that time. What did we learn from that era. As part of their learning they may engage in a special homework challenge that involves a focus on STEM (this is science, technology, engineering and maths). An example of this could be 'travelling on water' eg how the people at that time used water, boats, travel, moats, etc.
