The Stewart Mural has pride of place in the school situated just outside the Dining Hall and the other, which has been in storage for over 20 years, pictured here on the right, is by Glasgow Artist James Gorman . requested that the mural by Mr Gorman be unveiled as they are undertaking a research project on murals in schools. They came to Eastwood to view the Stewart Mural but were blown away by this other, lesser known, Gorman Mural. Art teachers and pupils took advantage of the good weather to view the Gorman Mural which had to be displayed outside because of its size and weight. Thanks to all members of staff who helped unveil this iconic piece of art.
