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Dealing with Litter Focus on Our School: 3-7 March

Most of the pupils in our school are very responsible and do not drop litter. They know that this is anti-social. It spoils our environment and it spoils the school's relationship with our neighbours. We include the issue of Litter in our Personal and Social Education programmes, and it is also discussed at assemblies. We also have an Eco Committee who promote respect for our environment.

However, as you know, there are too many pupils who thoughtlessly (or deliberately) leave a mess behind them, expecting someone else to clean up.

The City Council has a programme of Enforcement involving Fixed Penalty Notices (**Penalty = £50**) for leaving litter, and all secondary schools will be targeted. During the week before this happens, the issue of litter enforcement will be high profile in school.

During the week 3-7 March, Enforcement Officers will focus on the area around King's Park Secondary. This is what will happen:

- At least Two Enforcement Officers will work with school staff in patrolling areas which have the greatest problem.
- Pupils caught dropping litter will be required to give their name, address and date of birth to the officer. It is an offence not to provide this information. They will be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. The Penalty is £50.
- The Enforcement Officers will write to parents informing them of the Fixed Penalty Notice.
- If the Penalty (£50) is not paid, the process is:
 - o A reminder letter will be sent.
 - A case conference will be called, 0 considering sanctions such as a police visit.
 - Referral to the Reporter to the Children's 0 Panel.

This is a strong message, and we look forward to parents' support.

CHANGE TO TIMETABLE STRUCTURE FROM SESSION 2008-09 INVITATION TO MEETING OF THE PARENT FORUM – MONDAY 18 FEBRUARY 2008 AT 7 PM

I should like to invite you to a meeting of parents on Monday 18 February at 7.00 pm in King's Park Secondary School, as part of the consultation process in our move to a new timetable structure next session.

To explain – you may know that Glasgow's Education Services has five declared objectives which schools are to provide within our timetable structure. These are:

- 1. increased time allocation for physical education S1-S4 (also Scottish Government policy);
- 2. equalisation of teaching time for S5/S6 courses (at present English and Mathematics have more time);
- 3. increased time allocation for literacy and numeracy in S1-S4;
- 4. enhanced provision for pastoral care/tutor time;
- 5. efficient use of teaching time resources (especially important as we aim to provide a good range of subject choices for our pupils).

Glasgow's policy is that schools will move to a 33-period week timetable model in order to meet these objectives. Some schools have already done this, and others are required to do so from August 2008. The 33-period model can be configured in different ways, but each period lasts 50 minutes, and there are 'long' days and 'short' days. So the timing of the school day will change. Naturally we are keen to involve parents in the process of deciding what the new timetable will look like.

King's Park Secondary School's timetable structure of 25 periods per week (with week 1/week 2) has been in place for many years. However, it is not possible to sustain this model any longer, and we need to change. A working group have been looking at the issue. Ms Janie Munro, Chair of the Parent Council, represents parents on this group.

We would like to use the period between now and 5 March to consult pupils, parents, staff and other stakeholders on how the new structure will work. We will involve pupils through year group assemblies and discussion in Pupil Councils and focus groups.

At the parents' evening on 18 February I will give a presentation about the changes and there will be an opportunity for discussion. Your comments are invited by Wednesday 5 March.

The working group will look at all the responses, then will be in touch with you about the format of our new timetable.
